Mandated reporters are required to make a report of suspected abuse when they have reasonable cause to suspect that a child is a victim of child abuse under any of the following circumstances: They have contact with the child as part of work or through a regularly scheduled program activity or service OR

Finally, as researchers, we can contribute to the body of knowledge on child abuse prevention by examining the effects of mandatory reporting laws with large-scale population studies, and in particular pre-post studies of changes in reporting laws that can provide specific input as to the impact of implement policies.

Mandatory reporter laws may be in place in your state that typically requires people who work closely with children in their profession to alert the police or the appropriate authorities as to suspected abuse. Mandated reporters include teachers, healthcare personnel, mental health professionals, employees in youth serving organizations, law enforcement, and other professions as required by law.
